Thanks also to Sam Feldman who brings cookies weekly for our enjoyment.

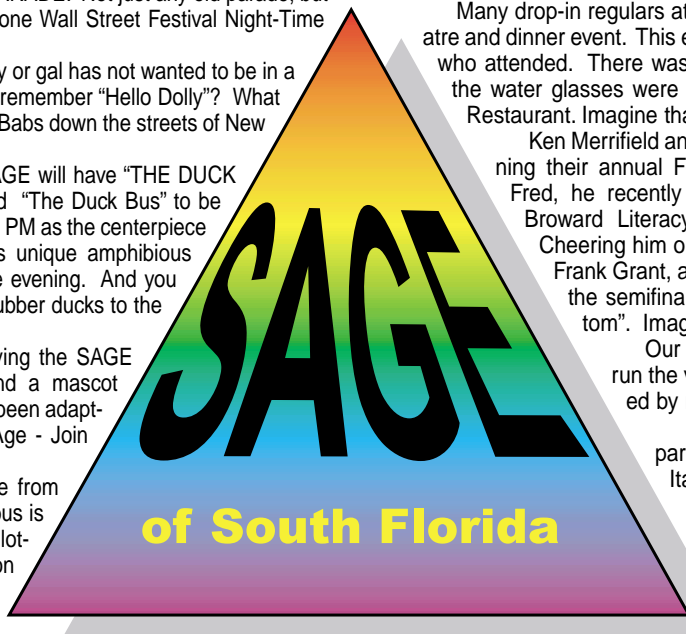
Ron Seidle and his partner

Our June 16th movie is "Capote".
Directed by Bennett Miller, this film
made Philip Seymour Hoffman a
star, after he won both the Oscar and a
Golden Globe as "Best Actor" for his
uncanny portrayal of Truman Capote.
In his quest for the "truth", while writing
"In Cold Blood", Capote falls in love
with a murderer (Perry Smith, played
by Clifton Collins, Jr.) - or does he?

All the while accompanied by Harper Lee (Catherine Keener) - herself a closeted novelist.

In just under two hours, fact and fiction are woven together, as we're taken on a ride into and around New York's cafe society; then transplanted to the Kansas boonies - where Capote is still able to hold court. And indeed, Hoffman does hold court as Capote. Not a mannerism is missed - not a facial tick or lisp ignored. But beyond that, there is his total inhabiting of the persona of the storyteller/novelist. We feel as Capote must have: A hesitancy to perpetrate a lie to expose the truth, by someone not himself worthy of redemption.

Everything about "Capote" is first-rate. As its 86 international award nominations and wins can attest.

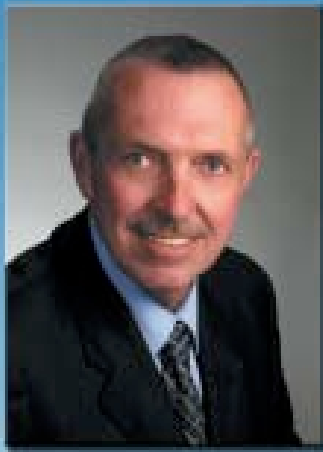
