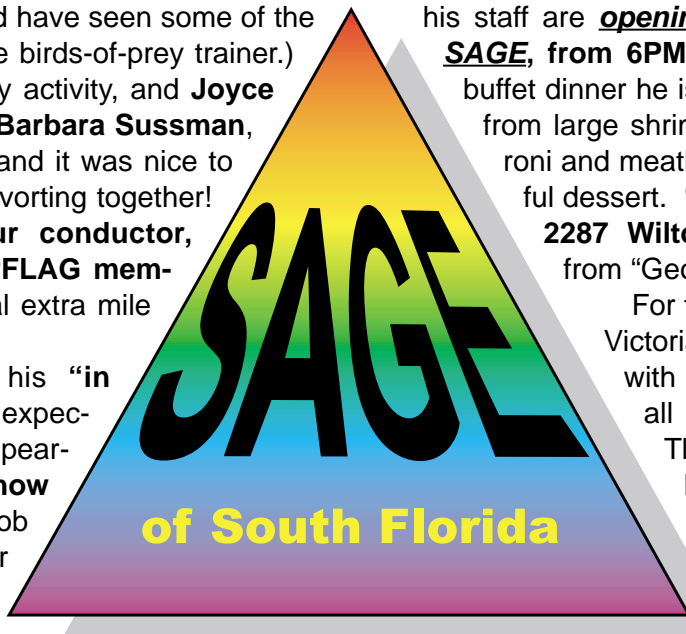

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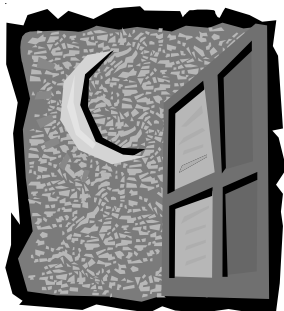

Do You Have Sleep Apnea?

At least ten million Americans have unrecognized sleep apnea, which is a treatable disorder that causes the person to stop breathing during sleep -- often hundreds of times during the night. Sleep apnea becomes more common as you get older. Find out more about this condition, and if you think you maybe affected, talk to your health care provider.

What is sleep apnea?



There are three different kinds of sleep apnea: obstructive, central, and a mixed type which is a combination of obstructive and central. In obstructive sleep apnea, the most common type, the soft tissue in the rear of the throat collapses and closes the airway so that

those affected stop breathing during sleep for a minute or longer. With each stop, the brain receives a signal to arouse the person from sleep in order to resume breathing. Consequently, sleep is fragmented and leaves the sufferer sleepy during the day but unaware that they were waking up during the night. Loud snoring, punctuated by periods of silence, is typical but not always present.

The consequences of untreated sleep apnea include high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, and weight gain. Those affected may also fall asleep during the day, have memory problems, morning headaches, depression, reflux, a need to use the restroom frequently during the night, and impotence.

Evaluation and Treatment

Treatment options may include: positional therapy which works to change the position of the sleeper; weight loss to eliminate additional fat around the neck; stopping the use of alcohol or central nervous system depressants; oral appliances to keep the airway open; surgery to create a more open airway; or continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP), which works by gently blowing pressurized room air through the airway at a pressure high enough to keep the throat open.

What's Your Snore Score?

- ▶ Are you a loud and/or regular snorer?
- ▶ Do you feel tired and groggy?
- ▶ Do you awaken with a headache?
- ▶ Are you often sleepy during waking hours?
- ▶ Do you fall asleep quickly?
- ▶ Do you fall asleep sitting, reading, watching TV or driving?
- ▶ Do you often have problems with memory or concentration?
- ▶ Have you been observed to choke, gasp, or hold your breath during sleep?

If you have one or more of these symptoms, you are at higher risk for sleep apnea. Risk increases if you are overweight, smoke, or use alcohol and/or have a large neck, a recessed chin, high blood pressure, or a family history of sleep apnea.

At least 1 in 10 people over the age of 65 has sleep apnea.

Though sleep apnea affects both women and men and people of all ethnicities, men are more likely to be at risk, as are African Americans, Pacific Islanders, and Hispanics. Women who are affected by sleep apnea are much more likely to develop it after menopause. If you think you may be affected, discuss these symptoms with your doctor or a sleep specialist.

Managing the Stress of Caregiving

A study conducted by the National Alliance for Caregiving and AARP found that more than half of those who provide care for parents experience stress and strain. Studies show that experiencing stress is not just unpleasant — it can negatively affect your health, well-being, and ability to provide care. When you are caring for others, take care of yourself with these tips from AARP.

- i **Eat nutritious meals.** Don't give in to stress-driven urges for sweets or drink too much alcohol.
- i **Get enough sleep.** If you are kept up at night, try a nap during the day to make up some sleep.
- i **Exercise regularly.** If necessary, find someone else to provide care while you walk or go to exercise class.
- i **Get regular medical checkups.** If you have any symptoms of depression (extreme sadness, trouble concentrating, apathy, hopelessness, thoughts about death), see a doctor right away. Depression is an illness that can, and should, be treated.
- i **Involve others.** Ask friends, neighbors and family members for help with household chores, home repair, driving, finding services you may need.
- i **Maintain social contacts.** Remember to have fun and focus on something else from time to time.
- i **Reach out.** Service organizations may be able to provide home health aides, shopping assistants, housekeeping, meal services, referral programs.
- i **Take time off.** Look into respite care and adult day centers.
- i **Talk about it.** Keeping your feelings bottled up can harm your immune system and lead to illness. Talk to friends, a counselor, or someone who has gone through the same thing. Share experiences with coworkers in similar situations.

With our **July 21st** selection, we return to the world of Independent Gay cinema. **"Boy Culture"**, released in 2006, is the highly eroticized story of a successful male hustler known only as "X" (**Derek Magyar**) and his tangled web of flings and affairs - most especially with an enigmatic older man (**Patrick Bauchau** - superb as Gregory Talbot), and two young roommates (**Jonathon Trent** as "Blowy Joey"; and

Darryl Stephens as Andrew).

Directed and Co-written (with **Philip Pierce**) by **Q. Allan Brocka** (best known for his previous film, "Eating Out"), this has been called "a slightly offbeat take on the world's oldest profession". But don't expect the male version of "Pretty Woman." "Boy Culture" is more savvy and street-smart, and more contemporary - and does not shy away from the idea that "sex pays - but love costs".

As X, **Derek Magyar** is not afraid to present an unsympathetic character, although one who asks for no sympathy from the audience. Andrew and Joey are a little too cute to be true, but their snappy dialogue and willingness to disrobe at any opportunity are ample compensation.

The film comes most alive in the conversations between X and Gregory. Intergenerational gay relationships are the missing link of contemporary gay cinema, and the way in which their friendship develops is handled with great poignancy and charm.

With seven wins in international film competitions, including the **2006 Grand Jury Prize for Best Screenplay** from **LA Outfest**, this is a small gem of a movie, which packs an emotional wallop in its 88 minutes.

"Boy Culture" screens on **Monday, July 21st, in Room 3 at the GLCC**. Dinner will follow. ***This is a SAGE sponsored activity.*** n

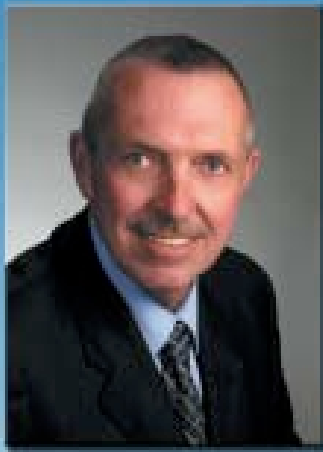
