Without giving up any of our autonomy, SAGE of South Florida has been asked to join with Founding SAGE, and all SAGE affiliates, in a confederation for the better good of the GLBT community. This confederation has been dubbed SAGENET.

In reviewing the ‘Statement of Relationship’ which was prepared by Founding Sage, your editor learned something very interesting. The original incorporation papers referred to SAGE as “Senior Action in a Gay Environment, dba Services and Advocacy for GLBT Elders”. What a revelation. We have always referred to the acronym SAGE as Senior Action in a Gay Environment, but now we can legitimately claim to be a service and advocacy group for GLBT elders. We always were.

Let’s remember that the next time someone asks us what SAGE stands for. ■

Our **August 18th** movie is the controversial and sexually-charged Australian import **"HEAD ON"**. You may have heard about this film, but chances are (unless you caught it in its limited U.S. run) you never saw it. Now is your chance to experience this film. But don't come expecting some of the lighter gay fluff that passes as gay independent filmmaking. **"Head On"** (as in "face your demons and yourself...") is a true drama with social and political connotations. It is definitely not a dramedy. At its heart is the story of a hunky, 19 year old Greek youth, struggling with his sexual identity. (**Ari, played by Alex Dimitriades in an award-winning debut.**) The kettle is on the boil and Ari is about to burst with a combination of his culture, sexuality and drug intake, colliding to create a mixed-up rebel-with-a-cause. His parents migrated to Melbourne, Australia, from Greece and with them they brought a strong culture that they hang onto, even though in their homeland the culture has changed with the times. Like every second-generation immigrant, Ari has to fight the ignorance and hypocrisy of his parents along with his social surroundings. This **creates a monster Ari carries within himself -a self-destructive energy that is spent in back alleys, public toilets and wherever he can get it.** And when people don't come over to his view of life, he manipulates them with sexual advances, testing their moral grounds. Through his love of Greek dancing, Ari yearns to keep part of his ancestral culture intact for identity purposes, but with his own freedom of expression. Can the two mix? That's what his journey is: **A journey toward self expression without any rules of repression.** Along the way, he has several homosexual encounters (and a clumsy heterosexual one) This is **Alex Dimitriades'** role of a lifetime (for which he received the **1999 Film Critics Circle of Australia Award for Best Actor**) as he chews through the character with raw conviction and wild abandon. **Director (and co-writer, with Andrew Bovell) Ana Kokkinos** gets right into the heart and soul of Ari, via the camera, with a confronting script, only 104 minutes long, dealing with issues aimed at any migrating culture. And, the **rest of the cast is equally superb** (and award-nominated as well): **Paul Capsis as Johnny; Julian Garner as Sean; and Elena Mandalis as Betty.** Winner of **9 international independent cinema awards (including the 1999 L.A. Outfest Grand Jury Award as Outstanding Foreign Narrative Feature, and the Milan and San Francisco prizes for Best Film and Best First Feature, respectively)** and nominated for 15 others, "Head On" is arguably one of the most important GLBT films we have shown to date.

Be Advised: "Head On" contains graphic scenes of sexuality, brutality, and both male and female nudity. It is primarily in English (with some English-subtitled Greek) and **screens at 4PM, in Room 3 of the GLCC.** To be followed by dinner. **This is a SAGE sponsored activity.** ■

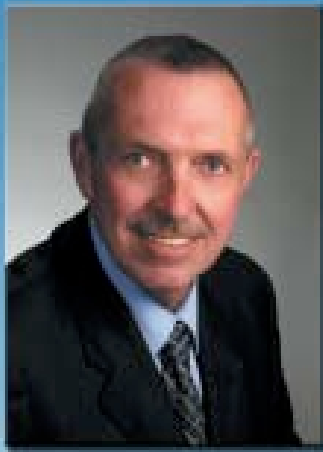
