4 THINGS THAT CAN KILL A RELATIONSHIP

A strong friendship is the key to a happy relationship. That includes mutual respect and affection, a sense of shared values and goals, and the ability to be influenced by each other, according to relationship expert John M. Gottman, PhD.

Through decades of research, Dr. Gottman has also discovered what he considers to be the "Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse" when it comes to relationships:

1. **Criticism.** Everyone has occasional complaints, such as "You forgot to take out the garbage." Criticism attacks a person's character. Examples include generalizations like: "You just don't care," and "You never remember anything."

2. **Contempt.** Sarcasm, eye rolling, mocking and mean humor show contempt. They tell your partner that you're disgusted with him or her and make it impossible to resolve a conflict.

3. **Defensiveness.** This is another way to blame your partner. "I didn't go to the store because I was fixing your car," is an example.

4. **Stonewalling.** Unwillingness to respond to your partner's requests sets in after the first three relationship killers are well in place. A stonewaller may look down or away and act like he or she isn't listening, even if they hear you.

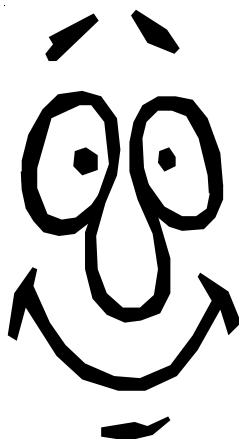

Simple Secrets of People Who Never Get Sick

We all know that to stay healthy we need to exercise, manage our weight, eat right, quit smoking – but growing evidence points to other simple strategies that play a big role in preventing disease, especially after 50. Here are a few simple tips from AARP.

Smile

Laughter releases those “feel good” hormones suspected of boosting immunity -- this might make you more resistant to disease. At the very least, laughter reduces stress hormones which have a bad effect on immunity. Hearty laughter provides an aerobic workout similar to more intense exercise like jogging. As little as 15 minutes of laughter daily may help prevent an heart attack by expanding the lining of blood vessels to improve blood flow.



Consider a Pet

Dog owners age 50 and older see their doctors less often, have fewer illnesses, and recover more quickly when they are sick. Just petting an animal has been shown to lower blood pressure. Animal owners also have a higher one-year survival rate following a heart attack, and have lower cholesterol levels than those without pets -- even when they do the same amount of exercise. Even watching fish has been found to help slow Alzheimer’s deterioration.

Read a Book

The more education you have, the healthier you are, studies show. This is not just because people with college degrees tend to have better access to health care. Higher education is also linked to an ability to delay gratification -- which means a reduced involvement with risky behaviors. A college degree is not necessary to reap the health rewards of education, though. Follow current events, read more, do things to keep your mind sharp.



Read Labels

Pay attention to the ingredients of the prepared foods you eat. The fewer the ingredients, the better. Eat “whole” foods such as unprocessed fruits, vegetables, and grains, instead of overly processed foods -- this may also help you fill up faster on less food.

Meditate

Health benefits have been associated with tai chi, meditation and yoga. These practices strengthen memory T cells, the white blood cells that fight recurrences of previously experienced infection. You may lose memory T cells as you age, but these activities boost their function.

Get a Good Night’s Sleep

Sleep is closely related to a person’s overall well being. Poor sleep increases hunger and impairs metabolism, which by themselves increase the risks of obesity and diabetes. However, restless sleep is common among older people. Tips for promoting sleep include: sprinkling your just-washed pillowcases with lavender water (vanilla and green apple are also sleep-inducing scents); a pre-bedtime snack of walnuts, milk, or yogurt which are rich in tryptophan, a natural sleep inducer; going to bed 30 minutes later than usual to help yourself fall asleep easier.

Our October movie is out-director **Joel Schumacher's** hip, hit cult classic "**The Lost Boys**". Written by **Janice Fischer & James Jeremias and Jeffrey Boam**, this is, of course, a retelling of the Peter Pan fable – with a twist. Its tagline reads: "Sleep all day. Party all night. Never grow old. Never die. It's fun to be a vampire." It's also the movie that unleashed **the two Coreys (Haim and Feldman, as Sam Emerson and Edgar Frog, respectively)** on the world!

After financial troubles force a mother (Lucy Emerson, played by **Diane Wiest**) and her two sons (Michael, a gorgeous, brooding **Jason Patric**; and Sam) to relocate to a small coastal town in California, the brothers become convinced that the area is frequented by vampires. Soon, the older boy starts sleeping days and staying out all night with the beautiful "Star" (a never-more ravishing **Jami Gertz**). Fearing for his own safety, Sam recruits two young vampire hunters (Edgar and Allen Frog) to save his brother by finding and destroying the head vampire.

So that you know how seriously to take all this, a favorite line is "You're a creature of the night, Michael. Wait till Mom hears about this." – Corey Haim as Sam.

Homoeroticism abounds, especially between **Kiefer Sutherland's** character (David) and Michael. But, not to be left out (of the closet), it seems that Sam actually may be on the brink of adolescent gayness. 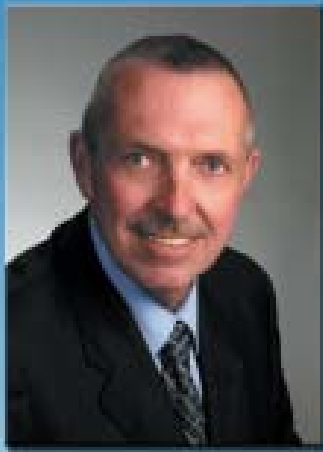

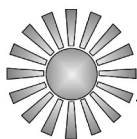
