MEDICARE News for Immediate Release: Beneficiary Info about the \$250 Part D Rebate



Our friends at the Department of Health and Human services have asked that we help educate our communities regarding the forthcoming \$250 Part D Rebates many of our elders may begin to receive. More information can be found on <http://www.medicare.gov/Publications/Pubs/pdf/11464.pdf>

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) posted at www.medicare.gov (under “What’s New”) “Closing the Prescription Drug Coverage Gap” a brochure that describes details about the tax-free, one-time check for \$250 for people who enter the Part D “donut hole” and are not eligible for Medicare Extra Help.

The first checks are being mailed June 10th — and checks will be mailed monthly after people have entered the coverage gap. To help fight fraud and protect beneficiaries from potential scams, Medicare is reminding seniors there are no forms to fill out to receive this benefit. Medicare will automatically send a check.

The envelope will have the US Department of Health and Human Services symbol on it and will say “Medicare Part D.” Beneficiaries don’t need to provide

any personal information like Medicare, Social Security, or bank account num-

bers to get the rebate check. They are reminded not to give any personal information to anyone who calls about the \$250 rebate check. People with Medicare should call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) to report any suspected fraud or scams or with

Our July 19th movie is the critically acclaimed 1994 film adaptation of the off-Broadway play "The Sum of Us." From BlockbusterOnline.com: "Three years before he became a household name in Hollywood (with 1997's "L.A. Confidential") Russell Crowe starred in this Australian drama, the directorial debuts of Geoff Burton and Kevin Dowling. Crowe plays Jeff Mitchell, a young gay man and the son of widower Harry Mitchell (Jack Thompson). The two live together while they both search for a special someone with whom to spend their lives. And while Harry is more than comfortable



with Jeff's sexuality, his new lady friend isn't, leading to tension and a personal struggle for Harry..." — Matthew Tobey, All Movie Guide. Also starring are John Polson as Greg and Deborah Kennedy as Joyce.

"The Sum of Us" won six International and U.S. awards (and was nominated for five more). Interestingly enough, while supporting co-star Polson won several awards, Crowe was not even nominated. If you went with SAGE to see the play at the Rising Action Theatre, you'll have an idea of the humor and sensitivity with which this film is underpinned. Based on his play (by screenwriter David Stevens), "The Sum of Us" was the 1994 recipient of the Australian Film Institute's Best Adapted Screenplay award. Just be prepared for Aussie-speak (we will have subtitles on) and a "breaking of the 4th wall" when characters address the audience — as in the play!

Research Study Seeks Gay Prostate Cancer Survivors

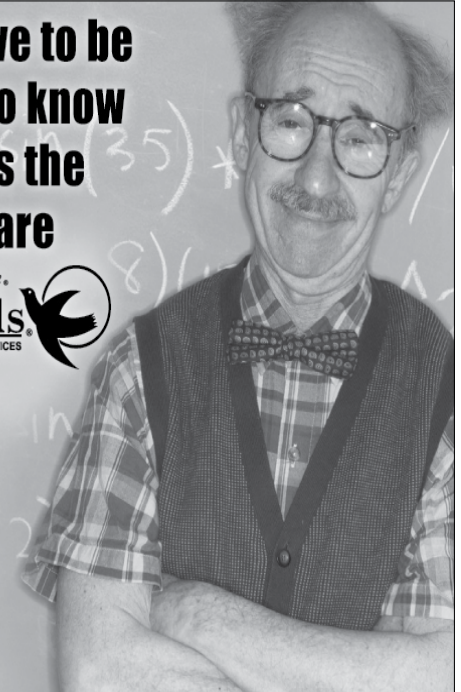

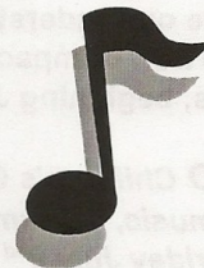

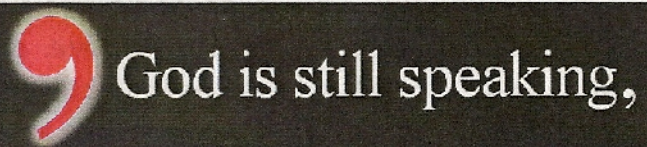
