SAGE Applauds Historic Change in Federal Policy

Following up on last issue's "Breaking News:"

On April 1st, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced steps to significantly improve the health and well-being of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) Americans, including an announcement -- effective immediately -- to notify states that they are empowered to treat same-sex domestic partners the same as married heterosexual couples when it comes to protection from "spousal impoverishment" under Medicaid.

"SAGE applauds the important steps taken by the Administration to ensure that the basic health needs of...(the LGBT Community) are fairly met, including the long-term care needs of LGBT older adults," said Michael Adams, executive director of SAGE (US). "We look forward to working with the Administration in continuing to improve the health of LGBT elders and other especially vulnerable members of our communities across the country."

Medicaid -- the single largest payer of long-term care in the U.S -- requires an individual to spend down all of his/her assets in order to become eligible for long-term care coverage. For married heterosexual couples, Medicaid has exemptions to avoid forcing a healthy spouse to give up the family home and retirement savings, and live in poverty, in order to qualify a spouse for long-term care.

Unfortunately, these spousal impoverishment protections do not apply to same-sex domestic partners, who can be forced to choose between long term care and poverty. The HHS action will notify states about their abilities to correct these inequities.

The steps announced by HHS also include policies that explicitly prohibit discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity in HHS employment and the administration of HHS programs; increasing the number of federally-funded health surveys that collect sexual orientation and gender identity data; and encour-



aging health profession training programs to include LGBT cultural competency curricula.

This announcement came during LGBT Health Awareness week, the same week that saw the Institute of Medicine release its groundbreaking report, "The Health of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender People: Building a Foundation for Better Understanding." The Institute of Medicine found a scarcity in research on LGBT people and called on researchers to improve data collection and learn more about the health concerns facing our communities, including LGBT older adults.

with John Gearthry and Carl M. Galli

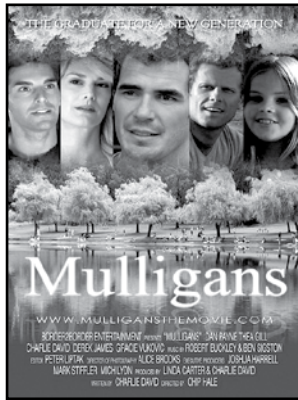
Our June 20th movie is an appropriate GLBT film for Father's Day, especially with so many of our members being fathers. Deriving its title from the golf term for second chances, *Mulligans* starts off as a deceptively simple gay-themed summer-vacation movie, but soon veers into quite different territory.

The Davidson family appears practically perfect in every way. They summer in a quaint lakeside golf community. There is love in abundance.

But when gorgeous hunk Tyler Davidson (played by Derek

Baynham, appearing as Derek James) brings his college buddy Chase (played by Charlie David, who also wrote the screenplay) home for summer vacation, a secret is revealed that threatens to tear his perfect family apart.

It's a summer when two young men discover the importance of friendship and second chances. And when the father, Nathan (Dan Payne) has to re-discover himself.



Directed by Chip Hale, *Mulligans* asks "What would you do if the one thing you wanted could ruin your life?"

This movie also features two outstanding performances from Thea Gill as the mother (Stacey) and Grace Vukovic as the precocious daughter (Birdie).

While this film flew under the radar when first released in 2008, it bears watching and discussing with your SAGE friends.

From IMDb.com: "The central characters are very deep and complex, the issues are not so black and white. More importantly, the resolutions are not so cut and dry. If this was the writer's first story, I look forward to seeing what else he has up his sleeve... So if you're in the mood to watch a well written, character driven story, that just has a splash of Gay in it check out *Mulligans*."

Mulligans won the 2008 Audience Award for Best Film at the Fort Worth Gay & Lesbian Film Festival, as well as the Q Award for Best Gay Film that year. And both Dan Payne and Derek Baynham were nominated for the 2009 Leo Award for Best Lead Performance by a Male in a feature length Drama.

It screens on Monday, June 20th at 4PM in the A/V Room at the Pride Center. With a running time of just 92 minutes, there will be plenty of time for dinner and discussion afterward. (We will be screening the unrated director's cut.)

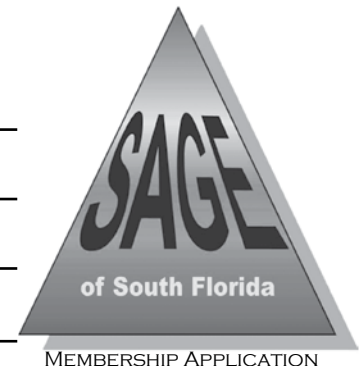

Occasional Thoughts

I have to admit it. I turned in my butch -- excuse me, my stud card and watched the royal wedding. Wasn't she striking?

I moved to Florida in the spring of 1977. That was the year it snowed in Miami, and the year that Anita Bryant and her Save the Children campaign succeeded in getting the anti-discrimination ordinance in Dade County repealed, but ruined her career in the process. This same campaign backed the ban on gay adoption. Those were pretty exciting times -- discouraging, but exciting. I marched in my first Gay Pride Parade, found MCC, and quit smoking. (It wasn't soon enough.)

I also started writing for gay publications. In 1979 I started writing for a short-lived magazine called *SHE* (not the current one). From 1981 to 1983 I wrote a weekly column for *The Weekly News*. (I think that's still around, isn't it?) I ran across these columns the other day and read them. They're very interesting -- and surprisingly current.

One of the things I wrote about was the danger of protective laws for gays. My premise was that if we think the government should stay out of our bedrooms, we shouldn't invite them in. And any time we ask for a law we are telling them that our bedrooms are, indeed, proper subjects for legislation. Any law that's passed can be repealed. And this state legislature that we have elected (who voted for these dinosaurs?) is just the kind to do that. Having beaten up on teachers and women of child-bearing age, do you re-

ally think that they are going to forget us?

I used to be a teacher, so I'm particularly interested in what is happening with them. I googled *homosexual teachers*, and I was appalled at the misinformation about gay teachers and gay parents listed. The information comes mainly from the Catholic Church and those "family" places in Colorado Springs (Focus on the Family, Promise-Keepers, and so on). (One of the listings even quoted Sodom and Gomorrah, and no Biblical scholar has interpreted this story as homosexual in decades.) These are the kinds of sources so many of our legislators believe. I wouldn't be at all surprised to see a witch-hunt for gay teachers. There are lots of them, so it might be a way to save money. Fire all the queers with master's degrees and replace them with 22-year-olds with bachelor's degrees.

I'm certainly not against protections, but we should be protected because we are citizens, not because we are gay citizens. **Instead of passing laws, I'd rather we repealed the repressive ones and left our freedoms to the courts rather than the legislature.** The federal government seems to be doing this. Obama has repealed Don't Ask-Don't Tell and has decided not to defend the Defense of Marriage Act. Gay marriage is moving right along, mostly through the courts.

Things these days are all mixed up. Republicans, who are supposed to want government out of our lives, can hardly wait to pass laws against individual liberties, while Democrats, who are supposed to think government is the answer to everything, are slowly getting government out of our lives. You can't tell the players without a scorecard.

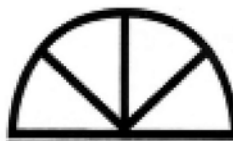

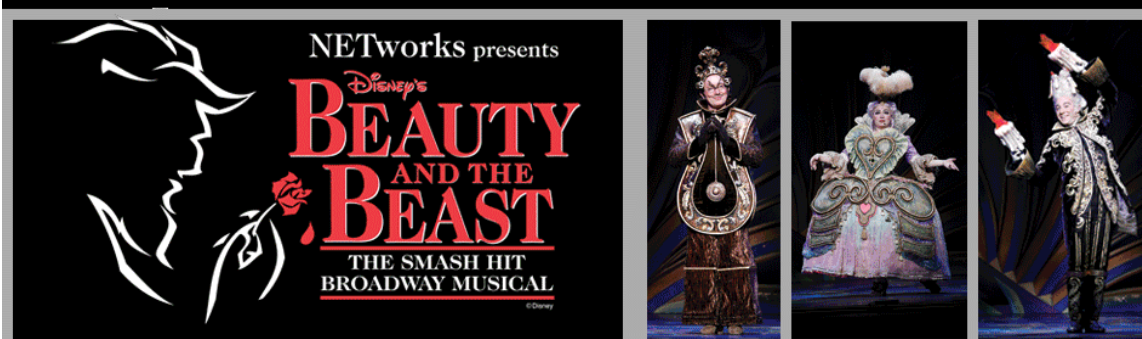

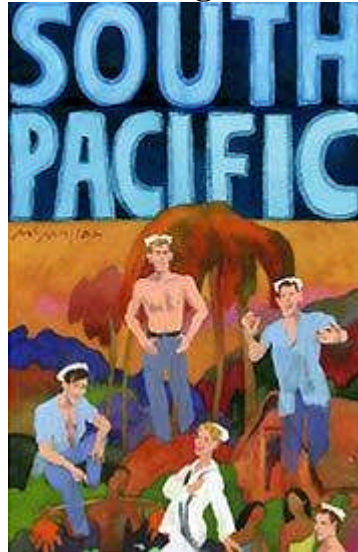
