JUNE GAY DAYS



On June 28, 1970, the first anniversary of the Stonewall "raid and uprising," thousands of people gathered in New York and marched from the Stonewall Inn to Central Park. This "Christopher Street Liberation Day" parade showed the visibility and solidarity of the LGBTQ+ community and underscored its commitment to fight for equality and respect. This "Pride Parade" became an annual event. Other American cities began holding their own annual commemorative events. In 2000, President Bill Clinton officially declared June as Pride Month.

Pride Parades and celebrations are now ubiquitous and not just an American phenomenon. *Gaytravel.com* lists June Pride events in Austria, Brazil, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and Thailand. Closer to home, we have our own Stonewall Pride Parade here in Wilton Manors on June 18th. And, during the first week of June Pride Month, the Orlando area and Disneyworld – "America's Happiest Place" – becomes one of America's *Gayest*.

Gay Days began one day in June, 1991, when over 3,000 LGBTQ+ persons attended Disneyworld wearing red shirts to make their presence known. By 2010, over 150,000 persons participated. The celebration has expanded to other theme parks and venues in the Orlando area and has become an attraction all of its own. Although the Disney organization has never officially sanctioned "gay days" at its complex, the company's tacit recognition of the importance of its LGBTQ+ market is reflected in recent political skirmishes.

So, however or wherever you celebrate Pride Month, take a moment to acknowledge your own journey of acceptance, validation and self-affirmation. Come along, and sing your song, and join the jamboree.



Please Note: There is a reason for **SAGE** to have a reservation cut-off date and time for each event. Therefore, no reservations will be accepted after such time.





SAGE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP



From the plains of the Midwest to the close humidity of New Orleans to the crazy heat of Los Angeles, Michael Grumley's Life Drawing travels the course of love and its destruction, of the fragile balance of commitment and exploration. Born in Iowa to the sounds of Bob and Bing Crosby and the Dorsey brothers, Mickey grows up to the comforting images of his living

room TV and the reassuring ruts of his parents' life. During the restless summer of his senior year in high school, drifting away from the girlfriend he could never quite love, Mickey spends a night with another boy, and his world will never be the same. On a barge floating down the Mississippi, he falls in love with James, a black card player from New Orleans, and in time the two of them settle, bristling with sexual intensity, in the French Quarter - until a brief affair destroys James's trust and sends Mickey to the drugs and images of Los Angeles.

Originally published in 1991, it was Grumley's only novel, completed in the months leading to his death from AIDS in 1988 as he was cared for by his lover Robert Ferro – also an AIDS victim. The book includes a forward by Edmund White and an informative afterword by George Stambolian (a close friend of the couple) that puts the novel in the context of Grumley's career. Altogether, it is a worthy lushly-lyrical fictional reminiscence and gay road-novel, valuable for its New Orleans sections.

Of Note: Both Grumley and Ferro were members of the Violet Quill (or the Violet Quill Club), a group of seven gay male writers that met in 1980 and 1981 in New York City to read from their writings to each other and to critique them. This group and the writers epitomize the years between the Stonewall Riots and the beginning of the AIDS pandemic. A cousin of the author is a member of the SAGE Book Club and will be present for the discussion of the book via **Zoom on** Saturday, June 11 from 11 AM to 12 noon.

Gay Plague 2?

As Senior Gay Men we survived HIV/AIDS and now another plague is among us. BUT this one caught early is curable and there already is a vaccine. I am referring to Meningococcal Disease. This is a bacterial disease not caused by a virus. New York, Chicago, and Southern California have noticed significant increases. It has reached South Florida and cases are growing. The increases are among Gay, Bisexual Men, and those with HIV. There are no known medical reasons why it is spreading in our population but there have been many deaths. When I was stationed at Camp Pendleton Naval Hospital in the late 60s we would have an outbreak at one specific site in the camp at our Marine recruits barracks every spring. We never found the cause. **South Florida Gay News (SFGN)** last month already had a cover story about this outbreak.

Communicability

The bacteria are spread by the exchange of respiratory and throat secretions (saliva and spit) via coughing or kissing or long contact in the same household. This bacterium is more difficult to spread than viruses such as COVID, the common cold, or the flu. BUT when it hits it can be deadly.

Signs and Symptoms

Meningococcal Disease has two common outcomes of infection:

- 1. Meningitis: The tissue covering the brain and spinal cord becomes infected and swells. Primary symptoms are fever, severe headaches and **stiff neck**; additional symptoms can be nausea, vomiting, and confusion.
- 2. Bloodstream infections: Symptoms are fever or cold chills, fatigue, vomiting or diarrhea, cold hands and feet, severe aches, pain in muscles, joints, chest or belly, rapid breathing, and a dark purple rash.

This is a serious disease and it can cause loss of limb, deafness, brain damage, and death. It is very important to <u>seek medical treatment</u> as soon as possible.

Treatment

The best medication is antibiotics as soon as possible. Unfortunately, up to 20% will die from the infection even with fast and appropriate treatment.

Prevention



The <u>best action</u> to beat this disease is <u>vaccination</u>. All Gay men/MSM regardless of their HIV status or risk factors should get the vaccination. If you have never received this vaccination or you have had one more than five years ago you should get one dose. HIV+ Gay Men will require two doses. Contact your Primary Care Practitioner for availability and insurance coverage. I will be getting one ASAP. Protect yourself and be safe.
