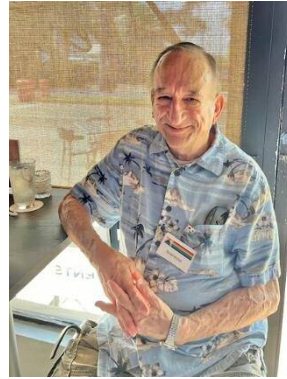

Those of you who would like to sit together at one of our events, please arrive early and at the same time, or wait for one another before checking in, so your party will be able to sit at the same table, if available.

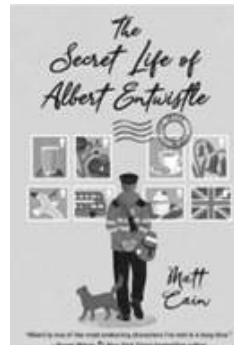

Matt Cain's *The Secret Life of Albert Entwistle* is a heartbreakingly sweet story about how times of crisis can trigger moments of rewarding growth. Melancholic and romantic, it charts one man's realization that it is never too late to live life to its fullest.

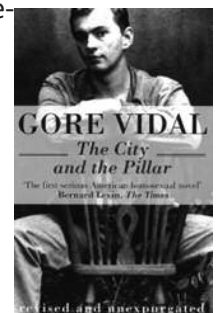
Albert Entwistle is a postman in an English country village, a creature of routine and privacy. Things are turned upside down when, on the eve of his 65th birthday, he is reminded of Royal Mail's mandatory retirement policy. He'll soon be without a job, without a routine. When events conspire to rip all his emotional support away from him, he is forced to confront the question... who is the real Albert Entwistle? Albert has lived his whole life in the closet. As the novel progresses, the reason why becomes clearer. Albert has never dealt with a key traumatic incident in his past and has lived under the specter of his own shame for decades. But now, with nothing to lose, and the world changing around him quickly, Albert hatches a plan to change his circumstances; but change is never that easy.

The Secret Life of Albert Entwistle has a cathartic edge to it, your emotions will be pulled from pillar to post(box) as you laugh, cry, and cheer along with the characters. It's about as far from 'misery-porn' as you can get, while still having some emotional oomph behind it. A lovely, charming read.

Aquarius



We all remember the Age of Aquarius and the hit song “Hair.” Our long luxurious hair but now, ALAS! Some of us lost it due to genetics or hormone (menopause) changes. Alopecia for senior men over 65 is 53% and for women, it is 37%. You can also lose hair (alopecia) due to prescription medications. We all know there is hair loss due to chemotherapy. How Do The Drugs Work? The medications regulate the brain hormones, digestive system, and adipose tissue (body fat). They suppress appetite cravings and give you a feeling of fullness. The medications are either pills or injections but both are equally effective. Some medications are for short-term (12 weeks) use and some are for long-term use.



These are medications that may cause hair loss:

1. Retinoids – high doses for treating skin conditions. Hair loss is reversible after stopping the medication.
2. Antidepressants – Bupropion (Wellbutrin) has a higher chance of hair loss, SSRI’s (Luvox), SSNRI’s (Cymbalta Efexor and Pristiq).
3. Anticoagulants – prevents blood clots. They are Heparin, Warfarin (Coumadin, Jantoven), Eliquis (Apixban) and Xarelto (Rivaroxaban).
4. Anticonvulsants – Prevent seizures common with Depakote (valproic acid) Lyrica (pregabalin) but less common with Keppra (levetiracetam).
5. Beta Blockers – treat high blood pressure as Propranolol (Inderal), Atenolol (Tenormin) and Metoprolol (Lopressor Toprol XL).
6. Antithyroid medications - treat overactive thyroid as methimazole (Tapazole) and Propylthiouracil.
7. Tamoxifen - used to treat or prevent breast cancer.
8. Certain arthritis medications - those used for rheumatoid arthritis and other autoimmune conditions.
9. Allopurinol (Zyloprim) – is used to treat gout.
10. Levodopa – aka (Sinemet) which treats Parkinson’s disease.
11. Ozempic – also Wegovy weight loss drugs. Clinical trials were reported to cause hair loss, but hair loss can occur from rapid weight loss.
12. Chemotherapy – used to kill cancer cells (Cytoxan) and doxorubicin (Adriamycin)

Medication loss of hair may be permanent, but it usually can be reversed by stopping the medications. Do not stop medications on your own, contact your health care practitioner. The practitioner may have other treatment options for hair loss caused by medications. Keep in mind that stress and chemical hair treatments may also cause hair loss. Monitor any strange side effects that may be from your medications.

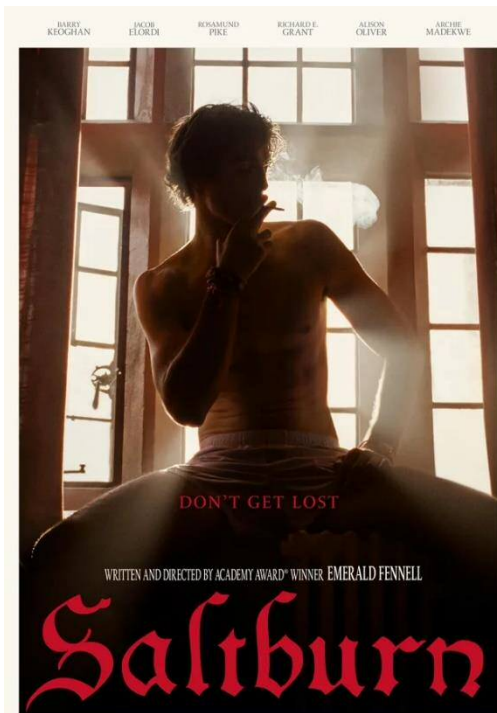

THE SAGE / PRIME GENTLEMEN MOVIE



Saltburn is about those gruesome human feelings of desire against the backdrop of a bright, sunny summer in England's most gorgeous castle, complete with a library and a maze. The movie follows the first semester and summer of Oliver Quick, a student at Oxford who, like any other first-year, just wants to be seen. The movie does an excellent job at depicting class differences, disparities, and especially the ignorance of the upper class, even if they're trying to be kind. Everyone treats Oliver like a charity case to make themselves feel better, and Oliver wants nothing more than to have friends that love him.

Saltburn delves into many interesting and complex themes: class differences, manipulation -a whole lot of manipulation, desire turning into obsession, many forms of symbolism, and revenge. And this movie is easily a cult classic. It's weird and twisted, cinematically beautiful in every frame, and especially complex with its characters. All of which make for an excellent film.

Broadway Backwards is the annual benefit concert celebrating the LGBTQ+ community via songs from musical theatre. Distinguished and emerging stars from the worlds of stage and screen come together in the celebration of LGBTQ+ stories and musical theatre. The one-night-stand revue has been gender-switching famous show tunes for eighteen years. In an Italian-American fever dream, **Bradley Dean** portrayed a Godfather archetype advising his son's suitor, played by **Nicholas Park**, to **Be Italian** in the signature song from **Nine**. Joined by a gaggle of gregarious gangsters, the full-out production number had the cast dancing sensually and sensationally amid red-checkered tablecloths strewn with glasses of Merlot.
